

WORKERS HAVE RIGHTS UNDER SOX!

The law says that employers cannot retaliate against employees of publicly traded companies for exercising their rights under the *Sarbanes-Oxley Act*. For example, workers have a lawful right to:

- Report to, or assist in an investigation by, an employer or a federal enforcement agency about conduct that the employee reasonably believes:
 - violates Securities and Exchange Commission regulations,
 - is mail, wire, bank or securities fraud, or
 - is fraud against shareholders

If an employer has retaliated against you, *act quickly!* Workers must file a retaliation complaint with OSHA **within 180 days after the alleged adverse action occurred or you became aware of it.**
